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**Solution Vs Heterogeneous Mixture** A heterogeneous mixture is a mixture in which the components of the mixture are not uniform or have localized regions with different properties. Different samples from the mixture are not identical to each other. There are always two or more phases in a heterogeneous mixture, where you can identify a region with properties that are distinct from those of another region, even if they are the ...

**Heterogeneous vs. Homogeneous Mixtures** Air with clouds is heterogeneous, as the clouds contain tiny droplets of liquid water.

**SOLUTIONS** are homogeneous mixtures. A solution is a mixture of two or more substances in a single phase. At least two substances must be mixed in order to have a solution.

**What are Mixtures and Solutions?** - Elmhurst University There are three families of mixtures: solutions, suspensions and colloids. Solutions are homogeneous while suspensions and colloids are heterogeneous.

**Solution.** Solutions are homogeneous mixtures that contain a solute dissolved in a solvent, e.g. salt dissolved in water. When the solvent is water, it is called an aqueous solution.

**What is a Solution?** A solution is a homogeneous mixture of two or more substances. It is called a homogenous mixture, because the composition is uniform throughout the solution.

The exception would be solutions that contain another phase of matter. For example, you can make a homogeneous solution of sugar and water, but if there are crystals in the solution, it becomes a heterogeneous mixture. Completely opposite of homogeneous mixtures, heterogeneous mixtures are two or more substances that are distinct from one another. The composition varies from one region to another with at least two phases that remain separate from each other, with clearly identifiable properties. Everything in a solution is evenly spread out and thoroughly mixed. Heterogeneous mixtures have a little more of one thing (higher concentration) in one part of the system when compared to another. On the other hand, an example of a homogeneous mixture is a salt water solution or a solution of water, with sugar dissolved in it. The appearance of the water, despite dissolution of salt/sugar, is uniform. Other examples are white vinegar and corn oil.
